## Teaching Translation as an Ethical Practice

5-8 September 2023

### Programme

The seventh annual ESLT Summer School will take place online, bringing together around twenty-five translators and educators from across Europe who are passionate about teaching literary translation.

As ever, the event is focussed on training the teacher of literary translation, and this year's theme is "Teaching Translation as an Ethical Practice". In recent decades, ethical issues have come increasingly to the fore in translation, but how can this "ethical turn" best be reflected in the teaching curriculum, and how can we approach the ethics of translation teaching itself? The programme includes a mixture of lectures, seminars and workshops.
